## <u>The Banyan Tree</u> by Rabindranath Tagore

## **QUESTION & ANSWERS**

Q 1: Why does the speaker call the tree Shaggy-headed? What caused the tree-top to become like this?

Answer: The speaker calls the tree Shaggy-headed because the branches of the tree are long, thick and twisted giving it an untidy appearance.

The tree-top became like this because many years ago, birds had nested in its branches, children were playing around it but now, all have left the tree alone.

Q 2: In what way does the speaker compare himself with the birds that used to live in the branches of the Banyan tree?

Answer: The speaker has compared himself with the birds that used to live in the branches of the Banyan tree because the banyan tree has forgotten both of them who played and rested in the shadow of the branches of the tree.

Q3: Stanzas 3 and 5 tell us what happens near the Banyan tree and how it appears to an observer. Describe in your own words, what takes place, the scene created and the effect produced.

Answer: There was a pond near the Banyan Tree where the women used to come to fill up their water jugs, the sunlight dances on the water and the animals play. Through this scene, the poet wants to appreciate the beauty of nature as well as he is reliving the fond memories of his childhood.
